

# COMMUNITY AMBULANCE FOR PT. WASHINGTON

**Flower Hill Hose Co. Donated  
Car — Ladies Auxiliary Helps  
Financially — Will Be Kept at  
Fire Headquarters and Carry  
The News Pulmotor.**

At a Fire Board meeting several months ago the Flower Hill Hose Co. donated to the Fire Department a Cadillac car to be used as an ambulance or relief car. The offer was accepted by the Department and suggestion was made of forming a Relief Corps of men, trained in first aid. At the December meeting of the Fire Board, Rev. D. B. McAlpine was appointed a committee of one to confer with the Port Washington Ladies Hospital Auxiliary on the matter of converting and equipping this car as an ambulance.

The undersigned, officers of the Auxiliary, will turn over to Mr. McAlpine \$200 of the \$400 which they collected for a hospital, toward this work; the remaining \$200 still drawing interest in the bank until such time as it is needed for a hospital.

The ambulance will be kept at Fire Headquarters and will be at the service of the entire community, and the Auxiliary felt that, as this money had been collected to equip a hospital, no better use could be made of this \$200 than to assist in equipping the ambulance until plans for the hospital are consummated.

It will carry the pulmotor now at Police Headquarters, obtained through the efforts of our late beloved Father, William M. Hyde; will be fully equipped, and on call at any time. It is hoped it may be in readiness early in April and will be ready for use as part of the Fire Department's equipment at the coming Nassau County Volunteer Firemen's Tournament to be held here in June.
