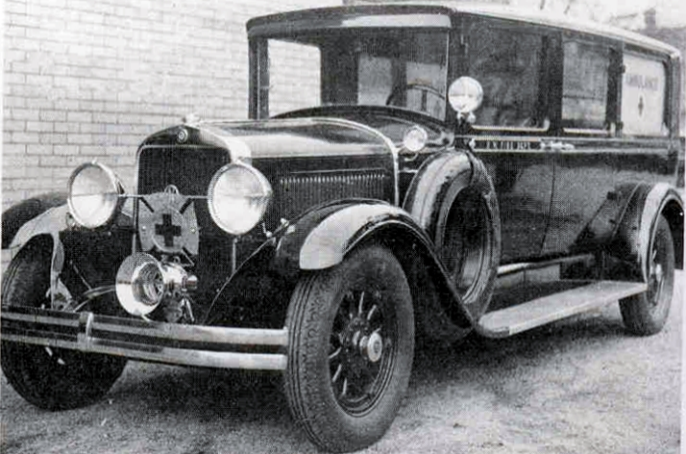

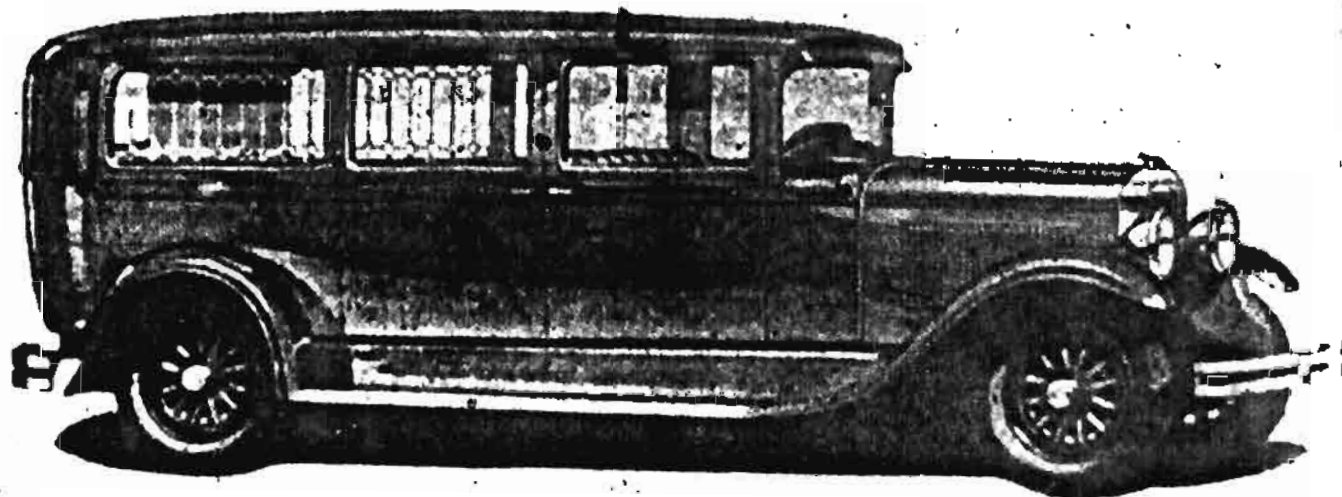

Local Fire Department Receives New 8 Cylinder Ambulance; Wish All a Happy New Year

The Fire Department wishes everyone a Happy New Year and that you will make its New Year happy.

The new Studebaker President Eight Ambulance was brought to town Christmas Eve by the Seaman Motor Sales. It was escorted down Main street by the fire apparatus and the old ambulance. All those who did not take advantage of that opportunity to see it can do so now by calling at the Hewett & Hazen garage on Iron avenue where it will be on display in the show room until it goes into active service on New Year's Day.

The old ambulance was purchased by John W. Rivera, who we understand intends to donate it to the Manhattan Fire Department. When it goes out of our hands we can say to it "Well done thou good and faithful servant" because in the year and one half we owned it, it answered seventy-seven calls of mercy and was responsible for allaying suffering and possibly saving life.

Let us now get down to business. Last week we acknowledged total donations of \$267.50 which after we deducted the deficit of \$129.25 showed a balance on the credit side of \$137.25. We have since then received the following donations:
