



FIRE DESTROYS ANDERSON HOME - 2 FIREMEN OVERCOME





The terrible Fire that destroyed the Anderson house off Cornwell Lane Saturday resulted in a loss of \$60,000 to the house and \$40,000 in furnishings. Blaze was discovered by the maid, Elizabeth Oakley, who was working in the kitchen and smelled smoke. On investigating she found flames coming from the wall in the TV room where two Anderson children were watching a program. Rushing them out of the house to Dr. Heinleins, she called police and firemen. Mrs. Anderson had left 15 minutes before, to bring home one of her children who was at the yacht club.

Firemen worked for hours but the pipe leading to the hydrant was too small to give sufficient water pressure altho Sands Point Village has plenty of water. Cause of conflagration is unknown.

Two Port firemen Martin Dooley and Tom Drum(of the Sands Pt. police) suffered heat prostrations and were rushed to the hospital. Nassau Fire Marshall Peter Lynch was unable to discover the cause of

the blaze.

Fire Chief Alex Morrison praised his men for their work. In order to get water free (500 gallons each) on each fire trucks was exhausted.

the vamps put an auxiliary pump at the swimming pool and endeavored to put out the fire, but too much headway and too little water made it impossible. The Anderson house, at one time the Jasper Bayne home, is back from the road several hundred feet.
